Dearest members of St. Matthew:

For quite some time now I have been watching, reviewing, showing, and evaluating the shoe "The Chosen". What an amazing show, "The Chosen" depicts Jesus and the many people around Him in such an amazing, true way, if you haven't been watching it, I highly suggest that you do. The first several episodes are tough to get into, but once it hits, it's a non-stop, put on another episode kind of show. I was watching last night Season 2, Episode 3, "Matthew 4:24", in this episode, Jesus is not "Present" until the last three minutes, but it was so impactful to me. In Matthew 4:24 the people are bringing out their sick and Jesus is healing everyone who comes out, Jew, Greek, Gentile, everyone. The Disciples are keeping guard and making camp at the same time. Mary, the mother of Jesus arrives and in the later part of the episode, Jesus is still out, but the Disciples and the women are all around the fire, telling stories about their life, asking guestions of each other to pass the time. Simon, who is a bit of a hot head, ends up trying to demolish Matthew about his past as a Tax Collector, well things get heated, some of the Disciples come to Matthew's defense, saying, he isn't a Tax Collector anymore, and some side with Simon, wanting an apology from Matthew for what he has done to the Jewish people over the years. As the scene starts to get intense, Simon says he will never forgive Matthew for what he has done, that Matthew turned his back on his people, and what makes him worthy to walk with Jesus! Jesus then walks by, sweaty, dirty, He has blood on Him, He is physically exhausted. The yelling stops as He walks by, thinking He might settle the debate, but He doesn't. He walks into His tent, and lies to go to sleep, we hear Him praying, thanking God for the day, and for good sleep that night. The Disciples are stunned at what they are doing.



When we take our eyes off Jesus is when we too become angry, extremely disappointed and frustration sets in. This seems to be a common teaching through out scripture, and yet we forget this very important theme. As we enter the Epiphany season then Lent, let us not take our eyes off the One who brings everything to us. The One who heals, the One who brought us out of darkness and into His marvelous light. When frustration sets, anger rises, look to the Son of God and His righteousness first and always. Lay your trouble at His feet, be reconciled, LOVE.
