It has been brought to my attention that there is some confusion about our situation at St Matthew, with Pastor Blaine's health, and our association with Pastor Craig. We rushed to put together a Voter's meeting in March because we were unsure of how Pastor Blaine's recovery would go and whether or not he would even be able return as a full time pastor. In the rush, we just asked for your permission to move forward in planning to care for our church. There were a lot of details that all depended on Pastor Blaine's recovery. I am sure we are all happy that Pastor Blaine has been able to return to service. His recovery is nothing short of a miracle. This is an answer to prayers and we continue to pray for continued improvement and health. I would like to clear up a couple initial concerns.

At the meeting in March, we incorrectly reported that Pastor Craig was already receiving \$1,400 per month for visitations. That amount was questioned and so we went back to take a closer look. The last payment to Pastor Craig was \$1,400, but was actually for 3 months. Pastor Craig has been receiving about \$450 per month for visitations. Some months are less, others are more, based on needs such as hospital visits, funerals and people that are close to death. Pastor Blaine has been unable to make many home visits due to mobility issues and illness, and it was important to take care of our members, so the Elders and Pastor Blaine requested the help of Pastor Craig. Part of those visits are budgeted under guest pastors, but that budget line did not anticipate the continued need for the extra assistance. It looks like we will need Pastor Craig's assistance for visitations for a while, but will not need him to fill in for the other pastoral duties. This will help limit the impact on the budget.

Please, if you have any questions or concerns, let us know. We do not mind answering questions and want you to be aware of everything that is happening in the congregation. Sometimes we may not have an answer right away, but that does not mean we don't want you to know. In addition to getting answers to you, it is just as important to have the correct answer. It is okay to email us or call the church office, and somebody can get back you you.





We will have a regular Voter's meeting on May 19th. These meetings have been fairly short in recent years, so there is time to answer additional questions. Please plan on attending meetings when they are scheduled. This is the best time to find out what is happening in the church.



The Ladies Guild is planning a Country Breakfast on Saturday, May 18th to assist with the additional pastoral expenses. There is also the possibility of a garage sale/thrift sale on that same day. Look in this communicator and watch the bulletin for additional details.


