Dear Members of St. Matthew...

Hold on tight everyone, this months letter is long. Actually I am sending you all a message that was told by Pastor Doebker at a youth retreat I attended many years ago. I will be writing it as it was told, and it will be in the first person, but remember, I was told this, it didn't happen to me, but I think we all need this reminder, so here we go...

I was on my way to a youth conference in California some time ago where I was the key speaker. My plane landed and I was waiting for my ride at the baggage pick-up. After a little while a tall unshaven twenty-one year old who looked like Shaggy from Scooby Doo walked up to me and asked, "Are you Pastor Doebker?" I looked him up and down, a bit confused and replied that I was. He lead me to his van and after loading my luggage I had a seat in the front of his van. To say I had a seat, well I sat in the front where a seat should be, but it wasn't and so I sat on the floor of the van with my back against the glovebox and looked up to "Shaggy". He was about six feet one and had a plastic spoon on a rope necklace around his neck. It was going to be a long ride to the hotel so we started to talk of many things. At one point I asked what part of the youth team he worked with. He advised me that he goes into the red light district of his city and saves young men from prostitution. As my eyes got big I heard this account from him.

The last time my partner and I went into a very seedy bar and sat at the bar awaiting and looking for someone to talk to. As we waited I started a conversation with the young man of twenty two next to me, "Do you come here often?" I asked, and with out looking to me he responded, "I'm not working tonight, take it somewhere else", after some small talk I discovered that he had been kicked out of his house when he came out as gay to his parents, and hasn't talked to them since, and now he prostitutes himself to make money. We continued to talk and I witnessed to him for some time to the point where there at the bar in this crowded club, I held his hand and prayed for him. When I was finished, he asked if he should call his folks, so I walked outside with him and my partner followed. He used his cell phone to call, as the conversation started he walked slightly away and in circles talking to his parents. After some time he returned to where I was standing and with tears in his eyes he said, "They want me to come home." That night we scheduled a bus ride home for him and I gave him some money for his trip. I got to tell you that seeing forgiveness in action can be powerful.

As I looked up at this young man driving the van I realized that I the teacher has become the student. And I was being taught by Shaggy, I was truly humbled in that van and realized myself how important forgiveness is and the great forgiveness Christ has given us. I then looked at Shaggy and asked him why he had a spoon necklace and what the meaning behind it was. He responded:

Well, when you look into the drawer with all the silverware in it you realize something. Knives are for cutting, forks are for stabbing, but a spoon is for serving. This is a reminder that we as God's children are to be servants to all.

Dear brothers and sisters of St. Matthew, we too are to be servants, Jesus tells us that He didn't come to be served, but to serve, and that the greatest of us should be the servant of all. As we continue through this beautiful thing called life, serve each other in joy, be humble and listen to others. You never know how God is going to use you or who He is going to put in your path as His representative. Be spoons my friends.

At our May Voters Meeting, concerns were brought up about major repairs needed throughout our facility. The boiler pump has been repaired and our parking lot is probably repaired and sealed as you are

reading this. There is a little bit of good news on the school roof. We found a reputable company that is able to apply a stabilizing layer of foam and a granule top layer to the roof that we expect will sustain the roof for at least 15 years, and at about 45% of the cost. (\$89,000) As of this writing, we expect our special voters meeting on June 23rd to approve this. There is still some major items



around the property, and we will need to replenish our capital improvement fund, but these are some big projects that were urgent and <u>are good to have done</u>.



Pastor Blaine is scheduled to have his back surgery in mid-July. He was hoping to avoid the surgery due to the brain bleed earlier this year, but the pain has been just too great, and it seems this is the only option. Please pray the the surgery and

recovery goes well so he can return to us in better condition. Recovery will take time, and we will have substitute pastors where we can.

As life changes around our church, life changes in our personal lives as well. Our Vice President, Craig Heigl and his wife Becky, are both retired now and plan to start traveling. Craig has already let the church council know that he will be stepping away from his position this fall. While he will help us out where he can, this will still leave a serious hole in our leadership team. We really need somebody to help out. We have been without a recording secretary since I took over the position of President, and now we need a Vice President. If we can fill just ONE of these positions, it will be a great help, but filling both of them would be wonderful.



If you would like to know more about these positions, or others, see me or any of the council members. **Many hands make for light work**. Too few hands, and you risk burning out the people who help all the time. Please prayerfully consider assisting us in one of these positions. I will happily help out and can provide any needed guidance to whomever may take on a position.
