


Dear Members of St. Matthew... I have been blessed in my life that I have had the pleasure of experiencing so many different adventures, locations to live, people I have had the pleasure to call friends. The most incredible location where all these seemed to come together in the year 2002. I had left my position as a Police officer in Cincinnati to work for a small township Department in a different county. Being excited to move Kristen and I sought out to live deep in the country and give a whole new life style a try, and we were blessed to find a small "Gentlemen's" farm in Russellville Ohio, believe it or not, on US 62, yes the same US 62 that now runs through Niagara County herein New York. Kristen and I were both city kids, we knew nothing about the new life we were going to jump into, and even less about how this move would impact us for the rest of our life.

When we moved in we discussed what kind of farm we wanted, animals we would like to raise, and all the options that comes with having the land to do most anything we desired. The first thing we did was divide our acres into pasture areas so we could rotate our future herds, and developed a huge garden area to attempt to grow our own garden food. The first three animals we purchased were from a Police Office/farm owner friend of ours, three Suffolk Sheep, from there we purchased a stable full of horses, cows, chickens, turkeys, a duck, and goats. Keep in mind we had zero practical education or knowledge on how to raise these beautiful animals.

For the sheep and goats, one friend educated us, for building and maintaining the garden, another neighbor educated us, for the cows my sixteen year old neighbor taught me so well, he was so knowledgeable that he went to Ohio State Univ. AG. Dept. on a full ride and is now a major cow farmer in Ohio. His father and two other friends taught me and Kristen horsemanship and riding skills. I learned how to farrier my own horses, train and even break horses for riding. My neighbor John taught me an "English Gentle Breaking" style of training our horses, no whips, no yelling, everything calm and reinforcing. After his continued instruction I was taught how to also gun break horses so you could shoot a shotgun while saddled on the horse and they stood perfectly still. John being the expert could accomplish this task in about forty five minutes, taking a green horse from wild to tame, it was quite impressive.

Kristen and I went through many horses, buying sick, mistreated or neglected horses, trained them, fed them, and mostly sold them off at a financial loss, but found them great homes. We had one horse that was a trouble maker, scared of everything and everyone, she wanted nothing to do with being ridden, let alone groomed. But she was beautiful. I worked with that horse often in our training pen and I dedicated a ton of time. It took a while, but in a few weeks I was able to ride her, and eventually use her in the cavalry in Civil War reenactment What she had to understand is the relationship I was trying to build with her, I wasn't stripping her of her identity, her spirit, I wanted her to trust me and submit to my will. This is tough to do, but when we worked together, when she understood that I was saying, "If you trust me, I will not hurt you.", and she learned to trust me and that I would not hurt her. When that connection was made a huge change arrived. She submitted, but she grew stronger and more bold and proud, not the skittish mare we once purchased.

God does the same thing for us, He desires us to know His and His Fathers will for our life, he desires that we submit to Him, not out of force, God asks us to submit to Him, but in doing so, so much more of our life is opened to us, new adventures that we would have never experienced had we kept to our old "easy, self-centered" ways. When we yoke to Christ, our burden is lifted, for He carries most of our hardship, we still tend to hold on to too much thinking we can handle it. But in truth, when we fully submit to our God, we are different, we walk different, talk different, handle our families, vocations and life completely different. We sacrifice our will to the Father in love knowing that when we do, He will not hurt us in anyway. In fact He does everything in His power to daily improve our life because we fully belong to him. He is the good shepherd, the Gate, the Door, our Physician, our Father, Brother, Spirit, Leader, our very Life.

When we use words like submission, we think of weakness, but that is a human thought not God's thought, submission is the surrender of our stubbornness and our way of doing things and giving God the reigns. As you continue in your beautiful journey of your life, daily submit to your loving Creator, your Savior, and your Redeemer. God doesn't just want you partly, or just for a weekend service, He desires your life in full, and in return gives the greatest pasture for a Christian, the ability to live "in a feast of fine food, well-aged wine, a heavenly banquet with Lamb in His Kingdom." A treasure in heaven open to all through faith in Christ.

Horses are easy, it takes a little hard work and consistency, God did the hardest thing ever, He humbled Himself becoming man to fulfill the prophesies, fulfill the law we cannot, to live the life we fail at daily, to pay the ransom that we owe Him. He did this for you, He does this for you, He will continue to provide every possible avenue for us undeserving sinners to be reshaped, reformed, and resubmitted to His good and gracious will. Take His lead, let Him escort you, lead and guide you to home with Him, forever and ever.
